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2020 PEDARE MUSIC SCHOLARSHIPS & BURSARIES

1. The Pedare Christian College Music Scholarship and Bursary Program recognises individual musical talent and the commitment of the College to this important area of the curriculum and the musical and worship life of the College.

These scholarships and bursaries are open to instrumentalists and vocalists and will be awarded to students who display outstanding musical ability and potential and a sound academic record. The College has a strong music culture with Concert Bands, a Stage Band, Choirs for all ages and a Jazz vocal ensemble, String Ensembles, two string quartets, percussion and guitar ensembles and a biennial musical, that we will develop with successful applicants. Applicants may have a contemporary, jazz or classical background in Music.

2. **2020 Principals Scholarships for Music Excellence** range in value from 25% to 50% remission of the College Tuition fees, for up to 3 years. Principals Music Scholarships are open to both external (new to Pedare) and current Pedare students. Only students currently in Year 6, 7, 9 or 10 are auditioned. Principals Music Scholarship recipients are expected to participate in a minimum of two extra-curricular ensembles at the College and study a full year of Music as a curriculum subject.

- Students applying for Year 7 or Year 8 Principals Scholarships for Music should be at a level of or at least equivalent to AMEB Grade 3 for Piano or minimum of Grade 1 for other instruments and need to be able to audition on at least one of the following instruments: Strings (including violin, viola, cello and double bass), Brass, Woodwind, Percussion, Piano, Guitar and Bass guitar.
- Students applying for Year 10 or Year 11 Principals Scholarships for Music should be at a level of or at least equivalent to AMEB Grade 5 Piano or a minimum of Grade 4 for other instruments, and need to be able to audition on at least one of the following instruments and are encouraged to audition with two instruments if they play them. The instruments are Strings (including violin, viola, cello and double bass) Brass, Woodwind, Percussion, Piano, Guitar and Bass guitar.

3. **2020 Music Development Bursaries** are designed to assist the development of students' music performance skills. Bursary students need to make a commitment to having instrumental tuition either via Pedare's Instrumental Music Program or externally. Bursary recipients are expected to participate in at least one ensemble at the College and study a full year of Music as a subject. Bursaries are open to both new and current students and commence when the student is in Middle School, Years 6 – 9.



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4. Students can audition for voice but are required to also play another instrument to the above-mentioned levels.
5. Preference may be given to students who play specific instruments, dependent on the College's needs at the time for bands and ensembles.
6. Short listed applicants will be required to attend an audition and interview with the Director of Music and College Principal.
7. Scholarship and Bursary recipients are expected to enrol in the classroom Music Program for a full year. (including Year 10 Music and SACE Stage 1 and Stage 2) It is expected that recipients will complete their secondary schooling at the College.
8. Scholarship recipients will be expected to be involved in the musical life of the College which may include participation in worship and assemblies/concerts and out of school hours functions.
9. Scholarship recipients must maintain a high level of application and performance through a commitment to rehearsal schedules, personal practice routines and must be having individual instrumental/vocal lessons at Pedare or through a private tutor.
10. Music Scholarships are reviewed annually and are dependent on satisfactory conduct and commitment to the College extra-curricular Music Program and sound academic results.
11. Applicants should prepare two pieces for presentation at the audition and are required to provide their own accompanist if needed. At the time of audition, students must show instrumental proficiency at the level specified and will be required to answer some music theory questions.
